Policy: Senior Student Privileges
Green Mountain Union High School

Policy

The Board of Directors of Green Mountain Union High School recognizes the achievements of the senior class and extends certain privileges to students determined to be *seniors in good standing*.

Definitions

Good standing refers to those seniors who have maintained satisfactory academic and disciplinary standards. A senior who has achieved grades of 70 or better in all classes (as determined from the most recent progress report or report card) and has not been assigned in-school (ISS) or out-of-school (OSS) suspension within the past 60 calendar days will be deemed to be in good standing.

Privileges

Seniors in good standing will have the following privileges granted to them:

1. The ability to leave campus during lunch if a parent/guardian has granted permission. Students over the age of majority may give such permission themselves.
2. Access to a specified portion of the building restricted for use only by seniors in good standing (i.e., the “senior lounge”) at any time during which the students does not have class.
3. The ability to leave school after all classes have been completed for the day and to arrive after the regular start of the school day if the student’s first class is later.
4. Any other privileges approved by the Administration on an annual basis.

Review and Revocation of Senior Privileges

The Administration will compile a list of students deemed to be seniors in good standing at the beginning of the academic year and each time report cards have been issued. After each review, those students no longer in good standing due to academic performance will be notified of the suspension of their privileges and will be given two weeks to improve performance to a satisfactory level. After two weeks, those students now in good standing will have their senior privileges restored; those still not in good standing will

have their privileges revoked for the remainder of the marking period. After each review, those students no longer in good standing due to disciplinary reasons will have their senior privileges revoked until 60 days has passed from the date of their most recent infraction.

The Administration is responsible for annually reviewing the privileges granted to seniors in good standing and may terminate one of the privileges at any time with reasonable cause.
